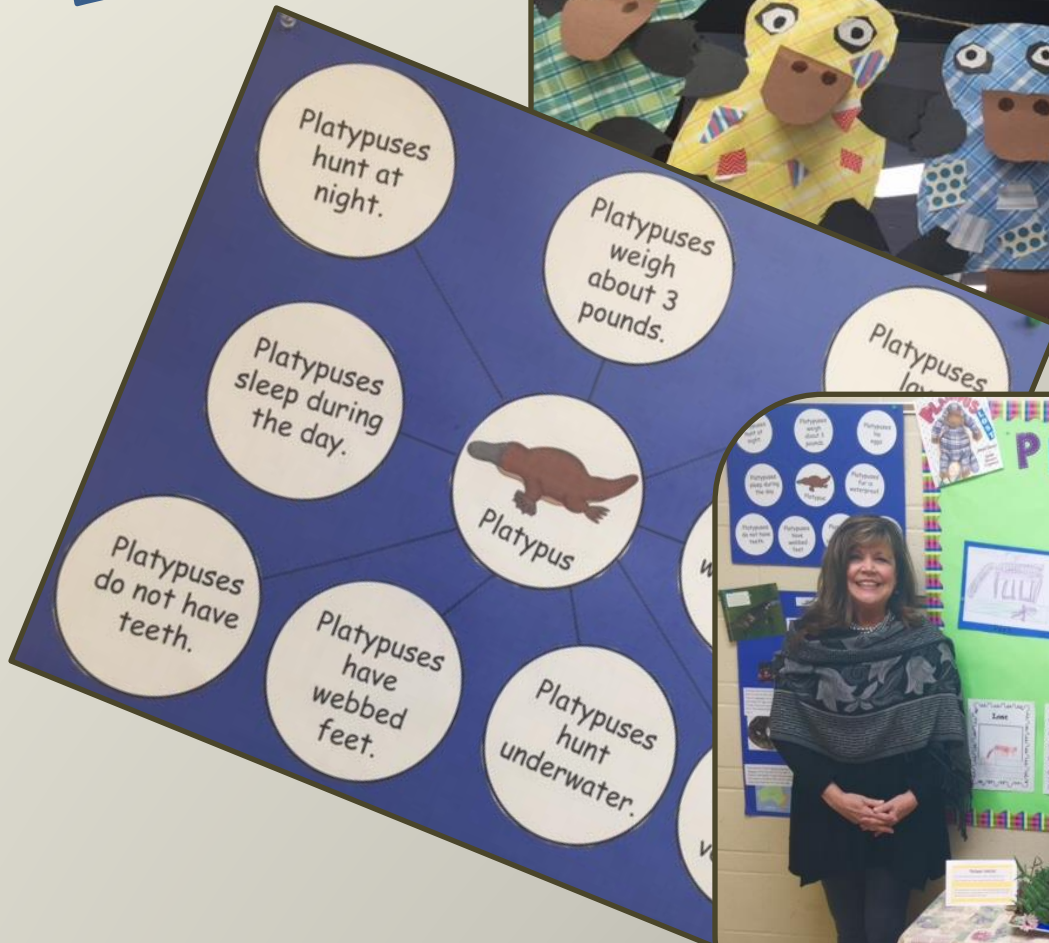

A comparison of two unlike things by saying that one thing is a dissimilar object or thing

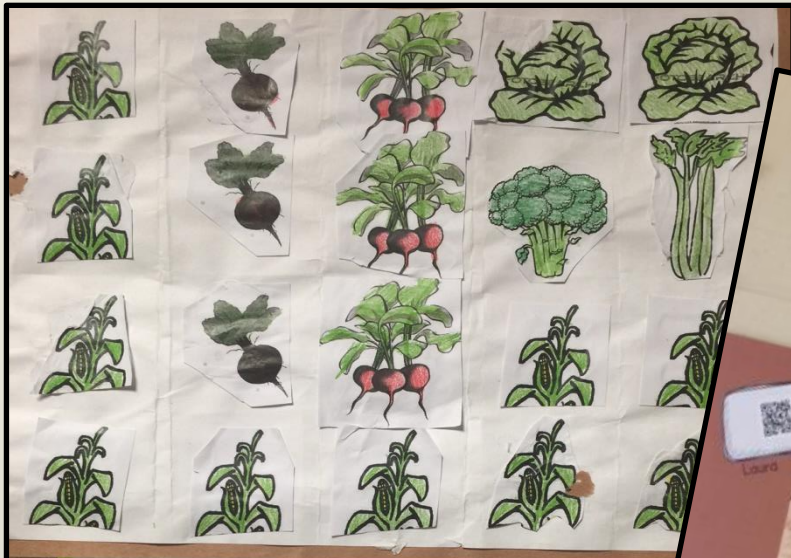
Their peaceful town was a battle ground

Broccoli $\frac{1}{20}$

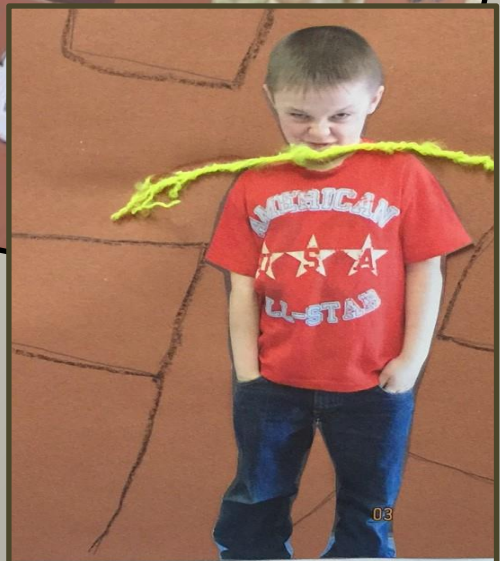
